Jesus is the good shepherd who cares enough to risk his life for us. The heart of the gospel is that though we are sinners, Christ died for us, and because of that sacrificial love, we are reconciled to God and to one another.



Being United Methodist means being connectional, which means all local United Methodist churches working together. The main way we can be connected is by paying apportionments to support the Northern Illinois Conference and the worldwide United Methodist Church. Do you know that in the 2025 budget (which was passed unanimously by the members of the annual conference in session):

- 16 percent benefits local churches and districts through equitable compensation, creation of new faith communities, and congregational redevelopment
- 30 percent funds programs that support the NIC's ministries, including the Board of Ordained Ministry and the Annual Conference Shepherding Team
- 29 percent supports clergy leadership for conference, districts and local churches
- 25 percent makes possible conference services, including the Board of Trustees, Archives and History, and Finance and Our apportionments to the worldwide UMC (sometimes called "the general church") contribute to the World Service Fund, Episcopal Fund, Ministerial Education Fund, Black College Fund, General Administration Fund, Africa University Fund, and Interdenominational Cooperation Fund. These funds support ministries that benefit our churches and our shared witness across the globe. Apportionments—"a portion meant for others"—is the priority for all UMC churches. Local churches, please pay your apportionment at 100 percent, if possible. Your faithful contributions benefit all NIC churches. By working together, we are much stronger than we would be as an individual church. This helps all of our sibling churches grow and make new disciples of Jesus Christ.




